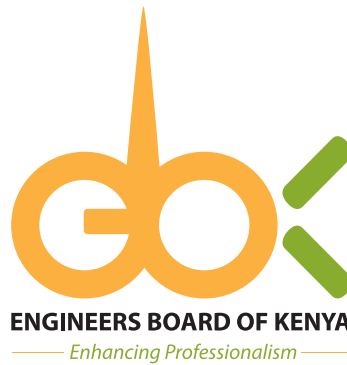




PUBLIC STATEMENT

The Engineers Board of Kenya is pleased to announce that it has been accepted as an Affiliate Member of World Federation of Engineering Organizations (WFEO) following Executive Council Meeting held on 27th October 2022 held at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris, France. The Board joins the Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) who are full members to WFEO.

The World Federation of Engineering Organizations (WFEO) is the international organization for the engineering profession. Founded in 1968, under the auspices of UNESCO, WFEO brings together national engineering institutions from over 100 nations and represents more than 30 million engineers. WFEO work to influence international institutions, to promote globally accepted engineering practice and to address the challenges of sustainable development around the world.

The World Federation of Engineering Organizations (WFEO) regularly engages with governments and policymakers with official status at the United Nations Social and Economic Council and co-lead the UN Scientific and Technological Major Group. It is an official partner of UNESCO (associate status) and work is designed and delivered by ten Standing Technical Committees and Policy Advisory Committees.
