Welcome to the 11th Issue of the Engineers Board of Kenya Newsletter. This is also to wish you all a Happy and Prosperous 2025!

2024 was a rewarding and eventful year for the Board. We registered the highest number of professional engineers in history, with a record of 474 bringing the total number of registered PE's to 3116. We remain focused on registering 10,000 engineers by 2028, having slightly exceeded 42% of the annual target of 600. This achievement has not only been a result of continued sensitisation, but we also want to acknowledge the support from all engineers and stakeholders in the built environment yearning to uphold standards and promote professionalism. Graduate Engineers are encouraged to apply for registration even as the Board continues to implement measures that enhance the efficiency and continuous improvement of professional examinations.

In 2025, we expect to expand our partnerships and enhance the quality of engineering programmes to increase registrations and improve both local and global recognition. So far, the Board has recognised 90% of engineering programmes offered in universities. We envision concluding on the remaining 10% by the end of this financial year.

This issue highlights key milestones, including our independent program reviews at Murang'a University and the University of Embu, ensuring that engineering education aligns with global standards. Our engagement at ACEK's and

IEK's annual activities reaffirms the importance of engineers' continuous engagement, professional development and advocacy in engineering practice.

In December, we strengthened our commitment to social responsibility by visiting ASN Upendo Village in Naivasha to support those affected by HIV/AIDS. We also participated in the World AIDS Day Half Marathon at Nyayo National Stadium, promoting awareness and action under the theme "Take the Rights Path: My Health, My Right!"

On the international front, the Board took part in several stakeholder engagements in Entebbe, Uganda. Additionally, GIZ organized a study tour to the European Union headquarters in Brussels, Belgium, to explore measures that would support the free movement of engineering services and professionals.

As we look ahead, we remain committed to excellence, embrace continuous learning, and actively participate in shaping the future of engineering in Kenya. Plans are underway as we look forward to hosting engineers and other stakeholders in the 6th Engineering Partnerships Convention.

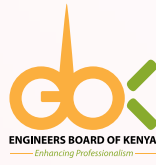

Engineering Kenya's Future: A 60-Year Legacy

For six decades, engineers have been the backbone of Kenya's progress, shaping every aspect that touch on the Citizenry fueling the nation's growth. On December 9, 2024, the Board brought together over 200 stakeholders in the built environment to celebrate this remarkable journey.

The Chairman Eng. Erastus Mwongera outlined the Boards bold vision: increasing registered engineers from 4,000 to 10,000 to meet Kenya's evolving needs. He also championed reforms that have halved registration time for professionals and praised the Graduate Engineers Internship Program (GEIP) for equipping young talents with essential industry skills.

Public Works PS Joel Arumonyang, representing the Roads and Transport CS, highlighted engineers' role in expanding Kenya's road network and power grid—achievements that have improved connectivity and electrified 75% of households. He also announced mandatory registration for all engineering projects before county government approval, ensuring greater oversight and safety.

A highlight of the event was the launch of the "Engineering @60" documentary celebrating the often-overlooked contributions of engineers.

ACEK & UNICAF Sign MOU to Boost Engineering Scholarships

The 2024 ACEK Annual Dinner brought together over 140 engineering professionals to celebrate industry achievements and foster collaboration. A key highlight of the evening was the signing of an MOU between ACEK and UNICAF University, offering scholarships of up to 80% for undergraduate and master's programs and 70% for doctorate studies to registered engineers.

ACEK Chair, Eng. Jane Mutilili, emphasized the importance of partnerships in advancing the profession, while EBK CEO, Eng. Margaret Ogai, highlighted the Boards achievements attained during the year such as the increase of engineer registrations and progress in recognition of university programs with the support of partners like ACEK among others.

UNICAF Country Manager, Winnie Otieno, underscored the impact of the Fourth Industrial Revolution on engineering, encouraging professionals to embrace emerging fields like AI, robotics, and IoT.



Inspiring the Next Generation of Women Engineers

With women making up only 11% of Kenya's registered engineers and 22% of university STEM students, EBK sponsored the STEM Boot Camp of Excellence from December 2nd to 5th, 2024. The event, held at Nairobi Primary School, mentored 300 girls from 26 schools in informal settlements under the theme "Bridging the Gender Gap by Unlocking the Potential in Girls in STEM for a Secure & Sustainable Future for All."

EBK Registrar and CEO, Eng. Margaret Ogai, encouraged the students, noting that 30% of girls are now choosing science subjects, a positive shift as Kenya refocuses policies on STEM education. She emphasized that engineering is a field for innovators and problem solvers, urging the girls to embrace challenges for long-term success.

Citing UNESCO data, she highlighted the global gender disparity in STEM, with women comprising only 35% of the workforce and 28% in engineering roles. Cultural and societal barriers persist, but initiatives like this boot camp are helping to pave the way for a more inclusive future in engineering.

EBK continues to uphold engineering education standards through independent program reviews.

On December 13, 2024, an EBK delegation led by Chairman Eng. Erastus Mwongera visited Murang'a University of Technology to assess the BSc. Mechatronics Engineering program for Board recognition. Commending the university's commitment to excellence, Eng. Mwongera acknowledged the proactive efforts of DVC Prof. Beatrice Mugendi in enhancing curriculum, faculty expertise, and learning facilities.

Similarly, on December 16, 2024, EBK conducted an independent review at the University of Embu for its proposed BSc. Civil Engineering program. The Board lauded the institution for seeking early-stage evaluation to ensure alignment with global engineering standards.

During both visits, EBK Registrar/CEO, Eng. Ogai, emphasized the importance of maintaining high-quality education standards and fostering collaboration between universities and the Board to continually improve standards. Eng. Prof. Silvester Abuodha, Chair of the Academic Qualifications Committee, reinforced that accredited programs guarantee students a well-rounded education, equipping them for professional success.

Empowering Future Engineers Through Innovation and Mentorship

The Technical University of Kenya (TUK) hosted an engaging three-day Engineering Expo from October 23rd to 25th, 2024, bringing together over 600 students eager to explore the future of engineering. Under the theme “Build, Innovate, and Connect,” the event provided a dynamic platform for networking, mentorship, and industry engagement.

As part of the sponsors, EBK participated, offering mentorship sessions and insights on engineering regulatory frameworks, collaboration, funding, innovation, and industry trends. The expo served as an invaluable opportunity for students to interact with professionals, gain real-world knowledge, and understand the role of engineering in shaping Kenya’s development.

Attendees expressed gratitude for the hands-on learning experiences, highlighting how interactions with exhibitors, particularly EBK, deepened their enthusiasm for engineering careers. With over 1,200 engineering students enrolled at TUK, the expo played a crucial role in bridging the information gap, inspiring the next generation of industry leaders.

Board Conducts Project Management Workshops

The Board conducted two comprehensive training workshops aimed at enhancing the skills and professional growth of interns under the Graduate Engineers Internship Program (GEIP). The first workshop, held in November, 2024, in collaboration with the Association of Consulting Engineers of Kenya (ACEK), focused on contract management for 85 Cohort V interns. Participants gained insights into critical aspects of engineering project management, including contract preparation, time management, cost control, and quality assurance. Speaking at the event, Eng. Grace Onyango, EBK's Director of Capacity Building and Accreditation, emphasized the importance of contracts in ensuring project success and highlighted the need for engineers to combine theoretical knowledge with practical skills.

At the closing ceremony, Registrar/CEO Eng. Margaret Ogai applauded the interns for their commitment and encouraged them to embrace emerging technologies like artificial intelligence while maintaining integrity in their practice. She also expressed gratitude to ACEK for their support in nurturing engineering talent.

A similar workshop conducted in December 2024 in Mombasa, provided Cohort III interns with practical sessions in project management. The program covered key areas such as stakeholder engagement, risk management, procurement, contract management, and quality assurance. As these interns near the completion of their three-year internship, Eng. Ogai urged them to submit their examination reports promptly to facilitate their registration as professional engineers.

Ministry of Roads and Transport Signs Performance Contracts for FY 2024/25

In a move to enhance transparency and accountability, the Ministry of Roads and Transport has signed performance contracts for the financial year 2024/25. The signing ceremony, presided over by Cabinet Secretary Hon. Davis Chirchir, took place at the Barabara Plaza Auditorium and brought together leaders from various state agencies under the ministry.

The performance contracts reflect the ministry's collective commitment to delivering on its mandate and aligning its operations with the government's Bottom-Up Economic Transformative Agenda. Speaking at the event, CS Chirchir emphasized the significance of performance contracts as a tool to ensure public officers meet their targets while driving progress towards national development goals.

Eng. Joseph Mbugua, Principal Secretary for Roads, expressed optimism about the impact of the contracts, stating that they would foster accountability and support the timely completion of critical infrastructure projects essential for driving economic growth.

Graduate Engineers Mentorship



The Engineers Board of Kenya (EBK) conducted a week-long training workshop aimed at mentoring graduate engineers on their journey to professional registration. The program brought together participants from key agencies, including the National Construction Authority (NCA), the National Police Service, the Kenya Institute of Highways & Building Technology (KIHBT), and the State Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Speaking during the opening session on behalf of EBK Chairman, Eng. Benjamin Maingi emphasized the urgent need to address Kenya's engineer shortage. "Kenya's ratio of engineers to the population falls significantly below the UNESCO-recommended level of one engineer for every 5,000 people in middle-income countries," he noted. Eng. Maingi underscored the Board's commitment to increasing the number of registered engineers, enhancing their competency, and fostering collaborations to create job opportunities.

"Our goal is to ensure the safety and integrity of engineering infrastructure while establishing a clear pathway for graduate engineers to transition to professional status," he added.

EBK Registrar/CEO, Eng. Margaret Ogai, highlighted the Board's ongoing reforms to streamline the registration process and provide greater support to aspiring engineers. In the 2023/2024 financial year, the Board trained 350 engineers through similar workshops. Of these, approximately 50% have applied for professional registration, with 474 engineers successfully registered during the same period.

Journey to the Washington Accord

To ensure adherence to global standards, the Board conducted a mock evaluation exercise at selected universities to assess their engineering programmes' readiness and simulate the accreditation process under the Washington Accord framework.

Speaking at Moi University on behalf of EBK Chairman Prof. Sylvester Abuodha, the Board reaffirmed its commitment to raising Kenya's engineering programs to meet global standards. Prof. Abuodha emphasized the importance of collaborative frameworks to address varying positions on the recognition of accredited academic programs by professional bodies. He urged universities to seize this opportunity to enhance the quality of engineering education, ensuring that graduate programs are internationally recognized.

These collaborations have helped align Kenya's engineering programs with international educational standards.

Prof. Isaac Njuguna Kimengi, the Deputy Vice Chancellor for Academics, Research, Extension and Student Affairs at Moi University, commended the board for its dedication to improving engineering education. Prof. Kimengi assured the Board of the university's commitment to advancing its global recognition in partnership with the Board.

Kenya's 60 Years of Diplomatic Journey

The 60th Anniversary of Kenya's Diplomatic Journey was marked by a vibrant series of events held from November 26 to December 7, 2024, at the Kenyatta International Convention Centre (KICC). The celebrations provided an opportunity to reflect on Kenya's diplomatic milestones since its independence in 1964 and to look ahead to the future of the nation's international relations.

The Engineers Board of Kenya participated in these celebrations to demonstrate the critical role the engineering profession plays in fostering national development and enhancing Kenya's global diplomatic stature. The Board showcased how engineers contribute to sustainable infrastructure and innovation, which are pivotal to Kenya's continued growth.

EBK Champions Environmental Sustainability

As part of its commitment to environmental sustainability and conservation, the Engineers Board of Kenya (EBK) actively participated in several tree-planting initiatives across the country. These activities aligned with Kenya's ambitious goal of planting 15 billion trees by 2032, reinforcing the nation's dedication to combating climate change and achieving a 30% forest cover.

Under the leadership of Cabinet Secretary for Roads and Transport, Hon. Davis Chirchir, and Registrar/CEO Eng. Margaret Ogai, EBK staff joined a mangrove tree-planting exercise at the Miritini Mangrove area in Jomvu Sub-County, Mombasa County. This event, held in commemoration of Mazingira Day, underscored the importance of ecosystem restoration and environmental conservation.

Additionally, Graduate Engineers Internship Program (GEIP) Cohort 5 interns and EBK staff took part in a tree-planting initiative at Eburu Forest, Nakuru County. Facilitated by the Kenya Forest Service (KFS) and supported by the local community, the initiative aimed to enhance forest cover and promote sustainable land management practices.

In December, EBK Registrar/CEO Eng. Margaret Ogai led Cohort III GEIP interns and Board staff in planting 2,500 mangrove trees at Junda Mangrove Forest in Mombasa County. This initiative directly contributed to Kenya's reforestation and carbon sequestration efforts, further aligning with government strategies to mitigate the adverse effects of deforestation and greenhouse gas emissions.

Speaking at the event, Eng. Ogai emphasized the need for collaborative partnerships and individual responsibility in environmental conservation. She lauded the involvement of local communities and youth, recognizing their pivotal role in sustaining long-term ecological balance.

With Mombasa and Homa Bay Counties designated as tree-planting zones for the Ministry of Roads and Transport, EBK remains steadfast in its commitment to sustainable environmental initiatives that contribute to Kenya's broader climate action goals.

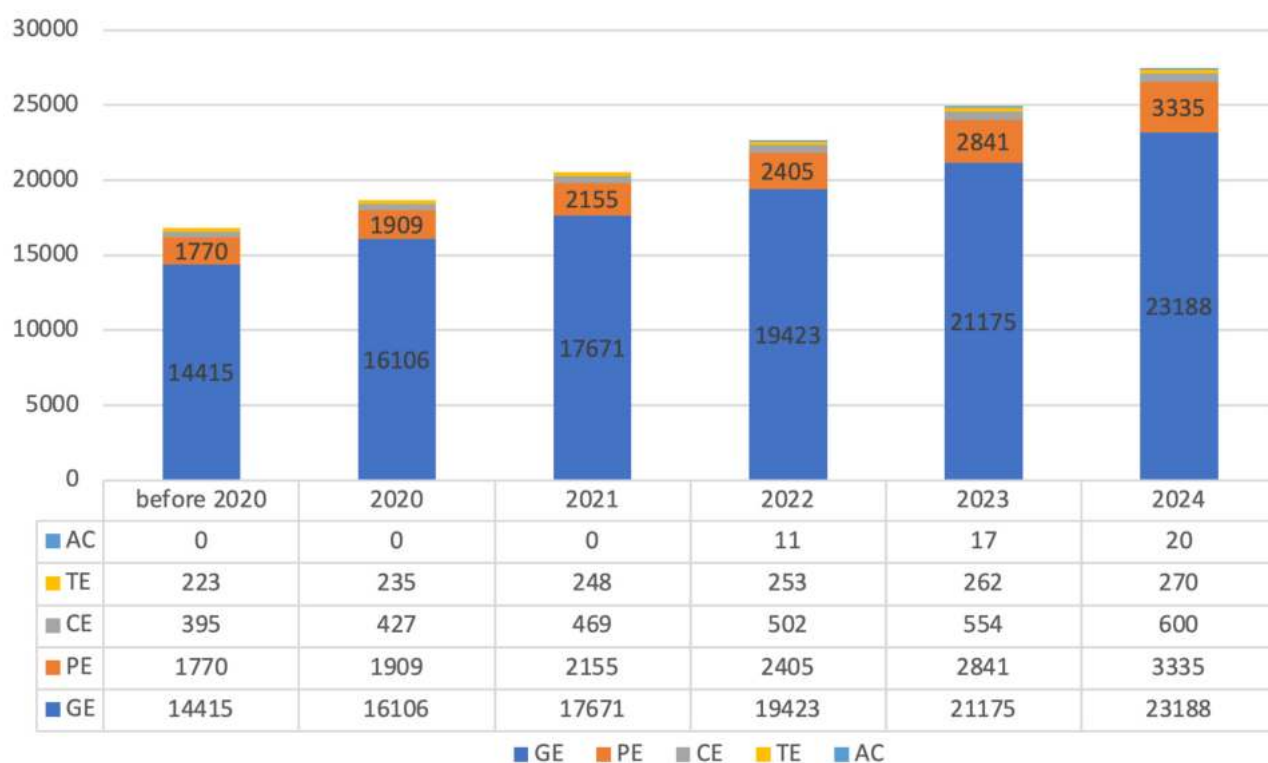

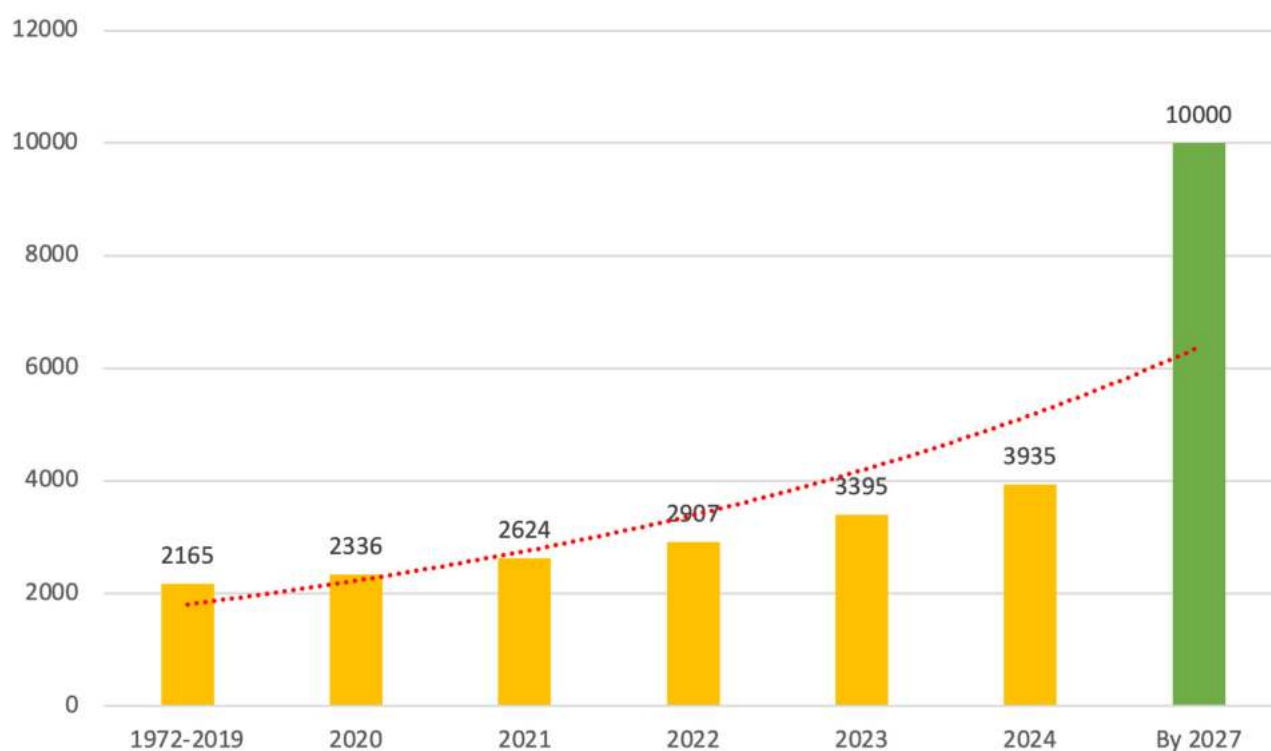


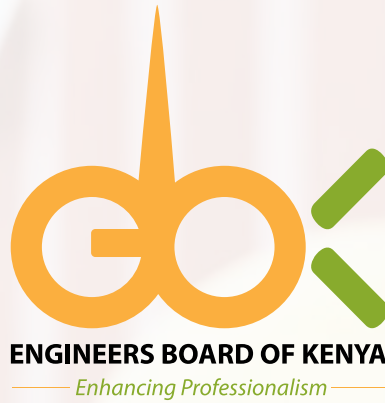
